Arrival and Dismissal



<u>Arrival</u> – Classes start at 8:50 am. This includes Music and Phys. Ed.. Please ensure that students arrive to school on time. Students may arrive anytime between 8:35 am-8:45 am. Students enter the building upon arrival. A staff person will greet them at their designated entrance door and additional support staff will ensure that students arrive at their classrooms safely once they enter the school. Children cannot be dropped off or arrive at school before 8:35 am. This is when supervision begins.

<u>Dismissal</u> – At 2:50 pm students will dismiss from the doors they entered in the morning. We kindly ask that families refrain from picking up students early, as it can be very disruptive to the school's operations and valuable instructional time. To ensure that every student benefits from a full day of learning, students will not be called down to the office for dismissal between 2:30 pm - 2:00 pm.

Parking Lot Safety

It is important that we work together to ensure student safety in the parking lot of our school. Please remember that the parking lot of the school is **strictly for staff** during the school day. Please take note of the many no parking signs on the street as staff are trying to safely load or unload bus students before and after school. Student safety is our number one priority.

On **Monday, September 15**, the lunch program is starting in your school. From noon August 29 until next Wednesday, September 3 at noon, you will be able to place your order for the first two weeks of nutritious, delicious school lunches by going to www.NSLunch.ca.

Ordering Lunches

Starting August 29 at noon, you can go to www.NSLunch.ca, click "Order Now" and select [Halifax Regional Centre for Education] to order lunches. You will be able to log into the system using your My NS Account or a student GNSPES account. If you do not have a My NS Account, the system can guide you in creating one. You can then create or modify diner profiles. To do this, you will need to select your school and input your child's name as it appears in this message:

Once the diner profile is complete and ordering opens, you will be able to choose between two daily lunch options, place your order and access the confidential payment system.

The full Nova Scotia School Lunch Program menu is available on www.NSLunch.ca. This year's menu has new and improved kid-approved options like chicken fingers, pizza, and mac and cheese.

Cost of Meals

The Nova Scotia School Lunch Program is pay-what-you-can, letting you decide the amount you want to pay for lunches. The amount you choose to pay through the online ordering system is confidential. Schools and food service providers will only know that a meal has been ordered.

Demographic Form Updates




Join us in observing National Day For Truth and Reconciliation

As there are no classes on Monday, September 29 and Tuesday, September 30, we welcome staff and students to wear orange on Friday, September 26.




