Please describe a summary of work undertaken by the SAC to improve student achievement and school performance.

- Throughout the 2025–26 school year, the School Advisory Council met on six occasions and continued to play an important role in supporting school improvement efforts related to student learning, well-being, and overall school effectiveness.
- Regular updates were provided on the implementation of the Student Success Plan (SSP), with discussions centred on the school's priority areas.
- The SAC received updates on literacy and math achievement and participated in ongoing conversations about ways to strengthen early literacy development and computational fluency skills through professional learning and targeted instructional supports.
- In alignment with the priorities outlined in the SSP, SAC members supported the allocation of resources to enhance student learning and well-being. Funding approved during the year included math manipulatives and resources to support computational fluency, literacy

materials that promote inclusive instructional practices, levelled text, flexible seating and experiences that foster student well-being, including trips to the Pottery Lab and a French concert.

- Members participated in both the Provincial SAC Conference Feedback Survey and the HRCE SAC feedback session with the Regional Executive Director.
- The Council reviewed the revised Provincial Code of Conduct and considered how it supports the school's updated vision and goals. Members also attended an information session regarding the reconfiguration of our school from a PP-4 to a P-4 configuration in response to continued population growth.

- The School Advisory Council continued to demonstrate its commitment to student achievement and well-being by prioritizing the allocation of resources to support high-quality mathematics and literacy instruction. Through the purchase of instructional materials and learning tools, SAC helped strengthen supports aligned with the school's Student Success Plan goals.
- In addition, SAC members recognized the importance of providing enriching experiences that support both literacy and student well-being. Funding was provided to enable students to attend a French-language musical performance at Mount Saint Vincent University, supporting French as a Second Language learning in an engaging and authentic context. The Council also supported Grade 4 students in participating in a pottery experience at St. Catherine's School Pottery Lab.
- Members felt strongly that these opportunities provide meaningful experiences that many students might not otherwise have access to and expressed a desire to continue supporting similar experiences for future students.
