Considerable amount of time at each meeting was spend discussing the Back to School Plan and Public Health Protocols related to safety, student achievement and school performance. We continued to discuss our SSP plan and how staff were working towards these goals, especially related to professional development: Math and Literacy Coaches, Math Support Teachers, and our work on Anti-Black Racism.

The SAC funded the purchase of culturally relevant books for our classroom libraries with a major focus on positive black characters (connected to anti-black racism). They are also committed to increased use of technology as we shared many times the work of our staff with incorporating technology to increase student performance, and have committed to the purchase of extra chromebooks.

The SAC met to decide on a new school photography contract. They chose a three year contract with Bluenose Photography, beginning in the 2021-2022 school year.
